### Digitalised Whole System Technical Code consultation

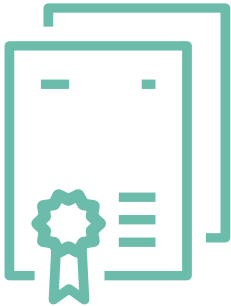
### The CCSG is now live

The Cross-Code Steering Group (CCSG) established as part of the REC is now live and has met for the first time.

This group's role is to review all new Modifications raised across many of the Energy Codes to identify any potential cross-Code impacts. Where possible interactions are identified, the CCSG will agree which Code should act as the 'Lead Code' and co-ordinate the progression of all the related Modifications.

## Principle Focus



We continue our look at the CACoP Principles, with the next being Principle 9. Principle 9 requires legal text to be produced and consulted on prior to a decision being made on a Modification.

Legal text is the term used for the marked-up changes required to the Code documentation to deliver a Modification. These set out the changes to the Code documentation that would be made if the proposal was approved. Once a Modification is approved, the legal text provided in the Modification Report will be implemented exactly as set out, so it is important this is fully accurate prior to the final decision.

For those Codes that have Workgroups, we aim to produce the legal text early enough during a Modification's assessment period for the Workgroup to comment and consult on. The Workgroup can ensure the legal text delivers the solution(s) being developed, and where necessary take on board comments from the consultation. This ensures the version attached

to the final Modification Report completely and accurately delivers the solution.

In any case, we will have the legal text ready by the time the Code Panel issues its final consultation on a Modification Report, prior to the final decision. Where respondents to these final consultations highlight non-material clarifications needed, the Code Panels can incorporate these into the legal text at the time of final decision.

In exceptional cases a Panel can agree not to produce legal text prior to final decision. However, such circumstances are extremely rare, and we would expect the Panel or Code Administrator to clearly set out why the legal text is not being produced. Under some Codes, low-level technical detail in the legal text may be developed and consulted on during implementation, when the full design and build of the system changes has been confirmed. We always welcome your feedback on how we are doing and if there's more you think we could do. If you have any comments or feedback on this, your Code Administrator will be happy to listen and capture your views.

## CACoP Products

The CACoP Forum has produced several items to help you navigate the cross-Code landscape:

- The [Central Modifications Register](#), updated monthly, lists all the open modifications across all the Codes.
- The [Horizon Scanner](#), updated every few months, summarises all the wider industry initiatives over the next five years which are expected to impact at least two of the Codes.
